Dear Troy Center Resident,

Did you know that the Town of Troy Sanitary District #1 recently paid for a feasibility study to review the long term viability of the existing water system that serves 50 customers in Troy Center? It had some very interesting results that the Sanitary District Board plans to discuss at a public hearing coming up on Tuesday October 18th and 6:30 pm at the Town Hall.

The study recommends spending \$1,400,000 over the next 20 years to start revamping the system. It recommends valve replacement, existing well house improvements, drilling a second well, and replacing the pumping equipment in the existing well house. This would cost each customer approximately \$28,000.

Another option discussed in the study considers the idea that every customer in the Sanitary District drill their own well and abandon the existing system that is in place. The study says this will cost customers approximately \$38,360.

These are big numbers and will influence your future finances significantly. If you would like your voice to be heard please attend the upcoming public hearing at the Town Hall on October 18th at 6:30 pm. The engineer that prepared the study and the Sanitary District Board will all be in attendance to listen to concerns and do their best to answer your questions.
